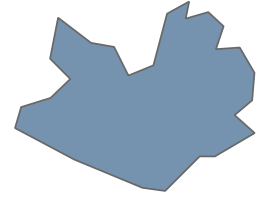

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 14 members in Daviess County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$869,572 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 269 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Daviess County received \$2,232,990 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 23 full-time staff and 2 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 191 children in Out of Home Care, 135 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$10,126.

16% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
83% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

11 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Daviess County received \$2,715,130 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 799 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 4,902 children a month, collecting \$8,535,525 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 238 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 28,259 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 72,121 of the 194,814 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 3,088 prescribers and 453 dispenser DEA numbers.
