

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 13 members in Daviess County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$664,539 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 295 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 10,441 people a month in Daviess County, stretching over 4,577 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$19,924,157

The KPAP helped 168 patients in Kentucky with 1,018 prescriptions to save a total of \$3,157,892 in prescription costs.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Daviess County received \$1,709,610 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$954,847. Additional grants totaled \$219,128. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Daviess County received \$263,351 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 528 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 4,707 children, collecting \$7,995,506 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 4,829 orders.

There were 202 children cared for by foster families, 150 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$11,848.

23% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 76% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 28,409 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 72,685 of the 197,083 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 3,092 prescribers and 439 dispenser DEA numbers.

Daviess is located in the River Valley region. This region received \$838,835 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
