

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 17 members in Daviess County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$1,281,157 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 372 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 11,239 people a month in Daviess County, stretching over 5,043 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$22,818,941

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Daviess County received \$1,723,379 in funding for 2 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 15,780, and 59% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$654,771. Additional grants totaled \$9,000.

Daviess County received \$4,115,055 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 974 providers a year. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 4,608 children, collecting \$7,706,215 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 4,712 orders.

There were 207 children cared for by foster families, 155 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$11,838.

16% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 83% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
