Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 36 members in Fayette County.

## Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$2,562,617 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 823 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 26,700 people a month in Fayette County, stretching over 12,506 households.

# Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Fayette County received \$5,779,458 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 48 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 565 children in Out of Home Care, 489 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$37,679.

33% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 66% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

23 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Fayette County received \$12,669,757 from the Child Care
Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 3,039
providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 14,441 children a month, collecting \$18,741,184 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 394 orders.

# Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 74,608 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 171,465 of the 493,978 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 6,581 prescribers and 845 dispenser DEA numbers.
