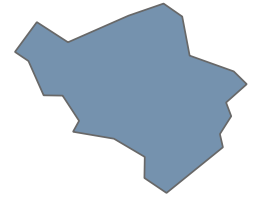

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 6 members in Fleming County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$169,991 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 51 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 2,145 people a month in Fleming County, stretching over 992 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$5,685,574

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Fleming County received \$822,727 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 4 full-time staff and 2 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 32 children in Out of Home Care, 26 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$1,742.

31% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
68% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

4 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Fleming County received \$205,786 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 68 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 548 children a month, collecting \$907,350 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 19 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,261 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 12,952 of the 31,649 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,378 prescribers and 201 dispenser DEA numbers.

Syringe Services Programs

Fleming County is served by the Comprehend Community Mental Health Center. Comprehend received \$3,457,655 in FY 2022.

Comprehend served 2,405 individuals in their region.



Fleming is located in the Comprehend Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$721,824 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.
