**AmeriCorps**  
Kentucky

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 43 members in Floyd County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$536,362 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 208 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 9,357 people a month in Floyd County, stretching over 4,443 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$18,304,396

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Floyd County received \$827,400 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$1,187,228. Additional grants totaled \$147,985. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Floyd County received \$32,647 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 80 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 2,472 children, collecting \$3,041,899 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 2,396 orders.

There were 116 children cared for by foster families, 112 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$8,955.

37% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
62% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

According to KASPER data, 12,159 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 72,010 of the 143,099 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.
