
Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Floyd County received \$827,400 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$1,187,228. Additional grants totaled \$147,985. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Floyd County received \$32,647 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 80 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 2,472 children, collecting \$3,041,899 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 2,396 orders.

There were 116 children cared for by foster families, 112 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$8,955.

37% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 62% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
