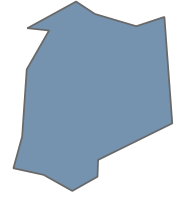

Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 7 members in Franklin County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$279,946 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 118 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 4,974 people a month in Franklin County, stretching over 2,287 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$9,884,168

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Franklin County received \$716,100 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$167,108. Additional grants totaled \$100,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Franklin County received \$180,291 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 348 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 2,012 children, collecting \$3,308,629 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 1,995 orders.

There were 160 children cared for by foster families, 113 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$6,823.

27% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
72% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 14,566 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 41,740 of the 99,428 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 3,426 prescribers and 482 dispenser DEA numbers.
