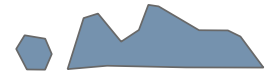

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 15 members in Fulton County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$95,208 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 41 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Fulton County received \$287,698 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 2 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 12 children in Out of Home Care, 12 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$572.

8% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
91% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Fulton County received \$34,691 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 16 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 693 children a month, collecting \$968,677 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 20 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,410 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 4,657 of the 10,555 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 533 prescribers and 80 dispenser DEA numbers.

Fulton County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$5,880,363 in FY 2022.

Four Rivers served 9,010 individuals in their region.



Fulton is located in the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$939,279 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.
