#### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Fulton County received \$287,698 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 2 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 12 children in Out of Home Care, 12 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$572.

8% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 91% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Fulton County received \$34,691 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 16 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 693 children a month, collecting \$968,677 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 20 orders.
