Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 12 members in Fulton County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$95,743 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 49 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,310 people a month in Fulton County, stretching over 666 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$2,505,564

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Fulton County received \$145,740 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$10,100. Additional grants totaled \$100,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Fulton County received \$7,270 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 17 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 634 children, collecting \$968,584 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 649 orders.

There were 11 children cared for by foster families, 8 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$377.

0% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

100% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,458 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analysesics accounted for 4,829 of the 10,708 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 588 prescribers and 90 dispenser DEA numbers.

Fulton County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$6,932,834 in fiscal year 2023.

Four Rivers served 8,799 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Fulton is located in the Four Rivers region. This region received \$1,249,155 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 106 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
