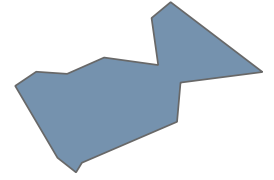

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 4 members in Gallatin County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$124,294 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 38 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 702 people a month in Gallatin County, stretching over 290 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$1,857,503

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Gallatin County received \$427,585 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 3 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 9 children in Out of Home Care, 8 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$575.

11% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
88% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

1 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Gallatin County received \$240,553 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 51 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 369 children a month, collecting \$704,359 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 39 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,373 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 4,130 of the 9,112 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 888 prescribers and 128 dispenser DEA numbers.

Gallatin County is served by the Northkey Community Mental Health Center. Northkey received \$8,417,964 in FY 2022.

Northkey served 11,278 individuals in their region.



Gallatin is located in the Northkey Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$3,271,755 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.
