

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Garrard County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$347,503 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 85 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 2,189 people a month in Garrard County, stretching over 955 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Garrard County Health Department: \$586,143

During fiscal year 2024, in Garrard county there were 10 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 526 participants who received benefits totaling \$491,692.

There are 1 WIC-approved grocers in Garrard County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 16 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county. (NOTE: 2023 and 2024 data is considered preliminary)

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Garrard County received \$266,097 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,525, and 59% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$338,443. Additional grants totaled \$2,000.

Garrard County received \$713,441 from the Child Care
Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 171
providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 788 children, collecting \$1,161,662 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 784 orders.

There were 45 children cared for by foster families, 39 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,608.

26% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 73% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,463 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 18,145 of the 41,834 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,957 prescribers and 300 dispenser DEA numbers.

Garrard County is served by the New Vista Community Mental Health Center. New Vista received \$15,984,022 in fiscal year 2024.

New Vista served 13,758 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Garrard is located in the New Vista region. This region received \$8,885,960 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 181 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 345 background checks for children & elderly services in Garrard county fiscal year 2024.
