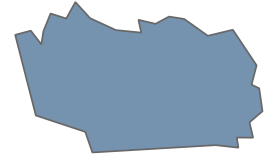

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$160,522 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 57 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 3,675 people a month in Grayson County, stretching over 1,737 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$9,730,552

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Grayson County received \$327,646 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 8 full-time staff and 1 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 84 children in Out of Home Care, 72 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$5,794.

33% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.  
66% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

0 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Grayson County received \$134,524 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 82 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,389 children a month, collecting \$2,217,851 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 78 orders.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 8,018 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 26,283 of the 64,305 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,197 prescribers and 327 dispenser DEA numbers.

### Syringe Services Programs

Grayson County is served by the Communicare Community Mental Health Center. Communicare received \$7,853,368 in FY 2022.

Communicare served 9,439 individuals in their region.



Grayson is located in the Communicare Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$1,411,168 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

## Public Protection

The Office of the Ombudsman and Administrative Review office had 289 constituent contacts in FY2022 in your county.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
