Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Green County received \$189,000 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$36,000. Additional grants totaled \$3,800. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Green County received \$29,545 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 53 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 403 children, collecting \$816,874 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 359 orders.

There were 11 children cared for by foster families, 11 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,160.

18% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 81% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
