Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)						

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Green County received \$190,827 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,590, and 64% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$122,240. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Green County received \$522,705 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 100 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 381 children, collecting \$724,826 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 329 orders.

There were 10 children cared for by foster families, 10 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,108.

50% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 50% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
