Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 3 members in Greenup County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$527,766 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 146 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Greenup County received \$630,012 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 12 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 45 children in Out of Home Care, 41 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$3,776.

20% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 80% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

16 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Greenup County received \$359,206 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 165 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,614 children a month, collecting \$2,565,634 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 68 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 9,009 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 27,976 of the 65,410 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,767 prescribers and 268 dispenser DEA numbers.
