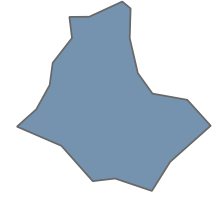

**AmeriCorps  
Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Greenup County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$573,896 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 143 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 4,359 people a month in Greenup County, stretching over 2,026 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$8,476,650

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## Health Services

Funding to Greenup County Health Department:  
\$1,185,432

During fiscal year 2024, in Greenup county there were 14 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 731 participants who received benefits totaling \$707,522.

There are 4 WIC-approved grocers in Greenup County.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Greenup County received \$510,568 in funding for 3 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 5,617, and 56% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$266,253. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Greenup County received \$698,457 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 219 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,477 children, collecting \$2,339,636 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,499 orders.

There were 62 children cared for by foster families, 61 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$5,674.

20% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
79% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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## Behavioral Health Services

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 9,530 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 28,262 of the 69,386 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,905 prescribers and 251 dispenser DEA numbers.
