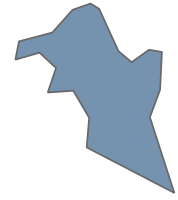

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$40,061 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 11 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 820 people a month in Hancock County, stretching over 348 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$2,159,685

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Hancock County received \$350,995 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 3 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 12 children in Out of Home Care, 11 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$280.

25% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
75% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

0 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Hancock County received \$50,628 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 17 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 395 children a month, collecting \$982,840 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 8 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,808 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 4,221 of the 11,500 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 691 prescribers and 120 dispenser DEA numbers.

Syringe Services Programs

Hancock County is served by the River Valley Community Mental Health Center. River Valley received \$6,160,914 in FY 2022.

River Valley served 5,649 individuals in their region.



Hancock is located in the River Valley Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$1,027,344 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

The Office of the Ombudsman and Administrative Review office had 151 constituent contacts in FY2022 in your county.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
