

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Hancock County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$41,065 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 18 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 888 people a month in Hancock County, stretching over 376 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$1,689,456

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Hancock County received \$172,410 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$89,991. Additional grants totaled \$0. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Hancock County received \$9,265 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 18 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 388 children, collecting \$929,251 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 298 orders.

There were 26 children cared for by foster families, 20 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$934.

23% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 76% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,907 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 4,256 of the 11,594 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 718 prescribers and 105 dispenser DEA numbers.

River Valley served 5,213 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Hancock is located in the River Valley region. This region received \$838,835 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
