Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$635,624 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 210 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

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FRYSC in Hardin County received \$2,045,183 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 25 full-time staff and 3 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 357 children in Out of Home Care, 282 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$20,196.

Telehealth Visits

26% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 73% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Hardin County received \$2,745,984 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 830 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 4,326 children a month, collecting \$9,752,375 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 188 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 30,141 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 75,337 of the 192,669 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 4,271 prescribers and 563 dispenser DEA numbers.

Hardin County is served by the Communicare Community Mental Health Center. Communicare received \$7,853,368 in FY 2022.

Communicare served 9,439 individuals in their region.



Hardin is located in the Communicare Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$1,411,168 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

The Office of the Ombudsman and Administrative Review office had 1,173 constituent contacts in FY2022 in your county.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
