

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 7 members in Harlan County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$947,014 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 270 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Harlan County received \$1,119,733 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 11 full-time staff and 2 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 27 children in Out of Home Care, 24 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$2,115.

66% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
33% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

2 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Harlan County received \$240,938 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 76 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 2,101 children a month, collecting \$1,984,644 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 80 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 7,234 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 40,975 of the 76,285 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,619 prescribers and 239 dispenser DEA numbers.

Syringe Services Programs

Harlan County is served by the Cumberland River Community Mental Health Center. Cumberland River received \$7,744,292 in FY 2022.

Cumberland River served 11,714 individuals in their region.



Harlan is located in the Cumberland River Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$2,496,403 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.
