

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 9 members in Henderson County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$454,179 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 150 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 5,104 people a month in Henderson County, stretching over 2,368 households.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Henderson County received \$972,794 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 10 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 74 children in Out of Home Care, 51 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$4,152.

27% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 72% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

8 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Henderson County received \$599,721 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 217 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 3,238 children a month, collecting \$5,627,259 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 139 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 14,066 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 43,178 of the 114,858 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,092 prescribers and 261 dispenser DEA numbers.
