Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 10 members in Henderson County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Henderson County received \$686,765 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 6,528, and 53% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$207,098. Additional grants totaled \$65,200.

Henderson County received \$1,236,121 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 370 providers a year. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 3,131 children, collecting \$4,843,117 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 3,082 orders.

There were 77 children cared for by foster families, 62 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$4,665.

12% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 87% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
