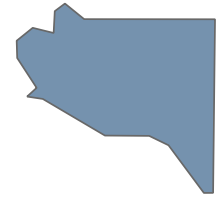

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$46,865 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 15 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 602 people a month in Hickman County, stretching over 286 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$1,634,599

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Hickman County received \$127,909 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 2 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 0 children in Out of Home Care, 0 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$0.

Hickman County received \$5,718 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 3 providers a month.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,209 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 3,437 of the 8,740 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 460 prescribers and 82 dispenser DEA numbers.

### Syringe Services Programs

Hickman County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$5,880,363 in FY 2022.

Four Rivers served 9,010 individuals in their region.



Hickman is located in the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$939,279 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

## Public Protection
