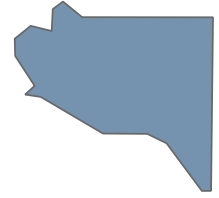

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Hickman County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$29,368 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 17 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 636 people a month in Hickman County, stretching over 296 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$1,171,229

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Hickman County received \$93,030 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$0. Additional grants totaled \$0. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Hickman County received \$594 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 1 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 215 children, collecting \$391,578 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 206 orders.

There were 0 children cared for by foster families, 0 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,084.

9% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
0% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,222 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 3,724 of the 9,183 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 478 prescribers and 96 dispenser DEA numbers.

Hickman County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$6,932,834 in fiscal year 2023.

Four Rivers served 8,799 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.

 Hickman is located in the Four Rivers region. This region received \$1,249,155 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 47 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
