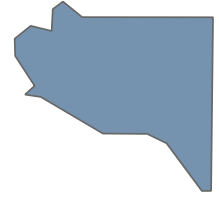

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Hickman County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$48,940 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 14 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 680 people a month in Hickman County, stretching over 317 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$1,238,612

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Hickman County received \$88,628 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 720, and 52% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$45,000. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Hickman County received \$36,375 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 16 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 215 children, collecting \$394,661 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 198 orders.

There were 2 children cared for by foster families, 2 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$24.

0% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
100% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,320 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 3,954 of the 9,907 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 528 prescribers and 93 dispenser DEA numbers.

Hickman County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$7,247,573 in fiscal year 2024.

Four Rivers served 8,324 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.

 Hickman is located in the Four Rivers region. This region received \$1,585,068 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 104 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 58 background checks for children & elderly services in Hickman county fiscal year 2024.
