Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC) Jackson County received \$285,390 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$214,434. Additional grants totaled \$77,300. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.						

Jackson County received \$12,125 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 27 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 743 children, collecting \$957,752 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 863 orders.

There were 32 children cared for by foster families, 30 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,460.

33% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 65% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
