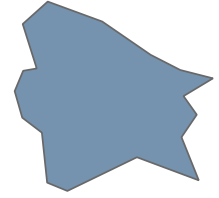

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 15 members in Johnson County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$414,261 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 155 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 4,716 people a month in Johnson County, stretching over 2,249 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$8,822,762

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Johnson County received \$500,010 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$346,024. Additional grants totaled \$158,500. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Johnson County received \$12,826 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 43 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,320 children, collecting \$1,795,823 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 1,310 orders.

There were 45 children cared for by foster families, 41 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,636.

39% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
55% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 6,755 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 33,787 of the 67,874 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,487 prescribers and 284 dispenser DEA numbers.

Johnson County is served by the Mountain Community Mental Health Center. Mountain received \$6,604,521 in fiscal year 2023.

Mountain served 29,355 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Johnson is located in the Mountain region. This region received \$1,860,567 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

## Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 349 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
