Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 16 members in Kenton County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Kenton County received \$2,788,126 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 29 full-time staff and 3 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 382 children in Out of Home Care, 332 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$26,857.

15% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
84% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

13 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Kenton County received \$5,781,010 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 1,279 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 9,697 children a month, collecting \$18,600,522 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 383 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)
