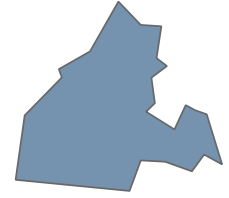

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in LaRue County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$236,123 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 62 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,799 people a month in LaRue County, stretching over 842 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$3,515,013

During fiscal year 2024, in LaRue county there were 5 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

LaRue County received \$215,210 in funding for 2 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,386, and 54% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$165,760. Additional grants totaled \$500.

LaRue County received \$430,607 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 133 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 557 children, collecting \$1,127,265 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 480 orders.

There were 11 children cared for by foster families, 9 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$878.

54% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
45% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,712 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 12,973 of the 34,898 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,515 prescribers and 234 dispenser DEA numbers.

Communicare served 8,252 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



LaRue is located in the Communicare region. This region received \$982,617 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.
