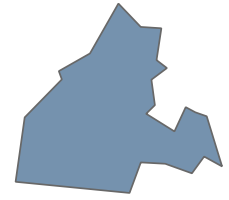

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Larue County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$132,082 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 38 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 1,690 people a month in Larue County, stretching over 772 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$4,485,819

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Larue County received \$307,671 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 4 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 11 children in Out of Home Care, 10 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$1,000.

27% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.
72% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

1 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Larue County received \$252,155 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 94 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 560 children a month, collecting \$1,204,324 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 22 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,507 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 12,968 of the 34,265 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,538 prescribers and 226 dispenser DEA numbers.

Syringe Services Programs

Larue County is served by the Communicare Community Mental Health Center. Communicare received \$7,853,368 in FY 2022.

Communicare served 9,439 individuals in their region.



Larue is located in the Communicare Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$1,411,168 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

Public Protection

The Office of the Ombudsman and Administrative Review office had 133 constituent contacts in FY2022 in your county.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
