Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Larue County received \$218,400 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$93,983. Additional grants totaled \$8,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Larue County received \$21,815 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 57 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 592 children, collecting \$1,101,438 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 488 orders.

There were 14 children cared for by foster families, 10 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$734.

43% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

71% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
