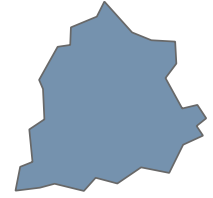

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 8 members in Laurel County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$811,953 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 348 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 11,392 people a month in Laurel County, stretching over 5,052 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$22,090,830

The KPAP helped 81 patients in Kentucky with 164 prescriptions to save a total of \$625,682 in prescription costs.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Laurel County received \$1,055,250 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$1,700,156. Additional grants totaled \$0. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Laurel County received \$70,095 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 168 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 3,380 children, collecting \$4,429,770 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 3,487 orders.

There were 145 children cared for by foster families, 117 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$10,940.

0% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
56% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 19,738 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 83,434 of the 180,703 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 3,131 prescribers and 454 dispenser DEA numbers.
