

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Lawrence County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$276,921 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 95 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 3,369 people a month in Lawrence County, stretching over 1,591 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$6,321,291

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Health Services

Funding to Lawrence County Health Department: \$1,306,422

Your county has 522 participants who received benefits totaling \$318,408.

Kentucky Prescription Assistance Program (KPAP)

The KPAP helped 6 patients in Kentucky with 25 prescriptions to save a total of \$42,598 in prescription costs.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Lawrence County received \$264,600 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$455,837. Additional grants totaled \$60,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Lawrence County received \$458 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 3 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 654 children, collecting \$867,703 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 670 orders.

There were 19 children cared for by foster families, 16 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,225.

31% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 100% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,874 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 22,676 of the 45,849 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,239 prescribers and 216 dispenser DEA numbers.

Lawrence County is served by the Pathways Community Mental Health Center. Pathways received \$6,633,297 in fiscal year 2023.

Pathways served 12,918 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Lawrence is located in the Pathways region. This region received \$3,006,898 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 259 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
