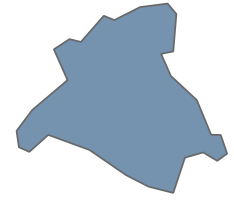

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 3 members in Lawrence County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$404,274 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 108 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 3,486 people a month in Lawrence County, stretching over 1,650 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$6,907,544

Funding to Lawrence County Health Department:

During fiscal year 2024, in Lawrence county there were 10 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Lawrence County received \$267,157 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,361, and 65% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$287,842. Additional grants totaled \$10,500.

Lawrence County received \$15,137 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 9 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 642 children, collecting \$896,664 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 600 orders.

There were 37 children cared for by foster families, 33 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,750.

21% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
78% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,096 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 22,412 of the 46,321 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,247 prescribers and 229 dispenser DEA numbers.

Lawrence County is served by the Pathways Community Mental Health Center. Pathways received \$7,882,552 in fiscal year 2024.

Pathways served 13,273 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Lawrence is located in the Pathways region. This region received \$2,007,623 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 179 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 638 background checks for children & elderly services in Lawrence county fiscal year 2024.
