Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 43 members in Leslie County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$229,403 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 66 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Leslie County received \$372,277 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 3 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 15 children in Out of Home Care, 13 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$1,165.

40% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 60% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Leslie County received \$21,604 from the Child Care
Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 8 providers a
month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 633 children a month, collecting \$666,533 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 10 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)
