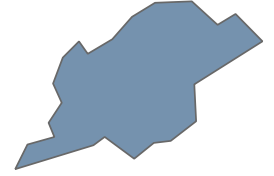

Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Letcher County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$646,283 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 163 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 5,099 people a month in Letcher County, stretching over 2,462 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$10,459,810

Funding to Kentucky River District Health Department:

During fiscal year 2024, in Letcher county there were 5 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Letcher County received \$494,453 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,928, and 71% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$256,227. Additional grants totaled \$9,000.

Letcher County received \$95,054 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 27 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,202 children, collecting \$2,064,080 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,228 orders.

There were 27 children cared for by foster families, 27 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,898.

55% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
44% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 7,439 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 39,015 of the 80,548 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,466 prescribers and 258 dispenser DEA numbers.
