


# **Lewis County - Fiscal Year 2022**

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Lewis County.

#### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$252,177 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 82 households in the past fiscal year.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Lewis County received \$267,674 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 3 full-time staff and 2 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 8 children in Out of Home Care, 8 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$527.

0% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 100% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Lewis County received \$84,711 from the Child Care
Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 34 providers
a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 608 children a month, collecting \$743,294 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 24 orders.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,989 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 9,679 of the 23,022 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,094 prescribers and 165 dispenser DEA numbers.

Lewis County is served by the Comprehend Community Mental Health Center. Comprehend received \$3,457,655 in FY 2022.

Comprehend served 2,405 individuals in their region.



Lewis is located in the Comprehend Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$721,824 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.
