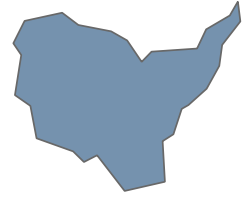

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 4 members in Lewis County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$205,572 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 77 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 2,691 people a month in Lewis County, stretching over 1,173 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$4,963,185

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Lewis County received \$251,790 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$54,326. Additional grants totaled \$0. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Lewis County received \$13,729 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 31 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 586 children, collecting \$753,884 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 547 orders.

There were 11 children cared for by foster families, 10 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$815.

28% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
72% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,912 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 9,344 of the 22,593 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,132 prescribers and 170 dispenser DEA numbers.

Lewis County is served by the Comprehend Community Mental Health Center. Comprehend received \$3,375,529 in fiscal year 2023.

Comprehend served 2,371 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2023.



Lewis is located in the Comprehend region. This region received \$813,700 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2023.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 124 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2023 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 50,778 background checks for children & elderly services across the Commonwealth of Kentucky in fiscal year 2023.
