Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Lincoln County received \$445,200 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$137,960. Additional grants totaled \$51,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Lincoln County received \$55,509 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 96 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,165 children, collecting \$1,681,507 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 1,162 orders.

There were 60 children cared for by foster families, 49 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$4,274.

0% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

71% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
