Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$125,792 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 56 households in the past fiscal year.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Logan County received \$498,540 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$764,049. Additional grants totaled \$74,475. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Logan County received \$67,627 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 133 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,491 children, collecting \$2,059,331 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 1,320 orders.

There were 32 children cared for by foster families, 28 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,160.

22% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

31% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
