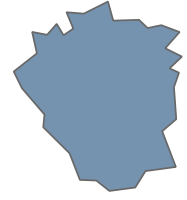

Kentucky

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 688 AmeriCorps members served 750,569 hours and recruited 4,705 volunteers who provided 181,290 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$5,429,636). AmeriCorps members served 45,685 students and provided food support services to 2,609 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 1,730 individuals and collected 75,035 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 24 members in Madison County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$774,993 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 317 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 9,900 people a month in Madison County, stretching over 4,723 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2023: \$19,366,049

The KPAP helped 101 patients in Kentucky with 246 prescriptions to save a total of \$520,301 in prescription costs.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Madison County received \$1,079,190 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$1,068,757. Additional grants totaled \$50,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Madison County received \$453,778 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 727 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 3,741 children, collecting \$6,323,286 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 3,825 orders.

There were 213 children cared for by foster families, 179 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$14,180.

52% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
58% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

18 child(ren) adopted

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 24,953 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 79,025 of the 192,903 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 3,747 prescribers and 581 dispenser DEA numbers.
