

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Magoffin County received \$433,510 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 6 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 30 children in Out of Home Care, 24 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of 1,793.

63% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 36% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

8 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Magoffin County received \$2,410 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 2 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 779 children a month, collecting \$995,606 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 20 orders.
