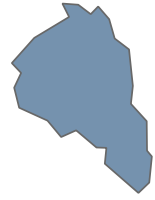

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$357,616 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 96 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 3,445 people a month in Magoffin County, stretching over 1,664 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$9,257,273

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Magoffin County received \$433,510 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 6 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 30 children in Out of Home Care, 24 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$1,793.

63% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.  
36% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

8 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Magoffin County received \$2,410 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 2 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 779 children a month, collecting \$995,606 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 20 orders.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,804 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 15,458 of the 29,796 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 906 prescribers and 161 dispenser DEA numbers.
