Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Marion County received \$355,759 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 6 full-time staff and 0 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 31 children in Out of Home Care, 29 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$2,616.

35% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 64% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

2 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Marion County received \$295,470 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 109 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 696 children a month, collecting \$1,419,404 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 56 orders.

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,145 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 17,401 of the 38,039 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,701 prescribers and 244 dispenser DEA numbers.
