Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

## Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

# Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in Marshall County received \$719,150 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 8 full-time staff and 2 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 98 children in Out of Home Care, 74 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$5,216.

50% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption. 50% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

2 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

Marshall County received \$464,776 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 129 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 1,119 children a month, collecting \$1,950,181 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 39 orders.

# Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 11,109 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 33,203 of the 86,842 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,432 prescribers and 229 dispenser DEA numbers.

Marshall County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$5,880,363 in FY 2022.

Four Rivers served 9,010 individuals in their region.



Marshall is located in the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$939,279 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
