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

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)					

Marshall County received \$423,780 in funding. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$307,525. Additional grants totaled \$51,500. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

Marshall County received \$47,858 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 96 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,023 children, collecting \$1,715,115 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 936 orders.

There were 13 children cared for by foster families, 13 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,100.

50% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 92% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
