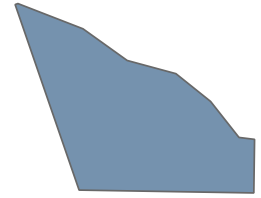

Across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky 3,729 Serve Kentucky volunteers provided 792,753 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$1,032,063) in a little over a year between August 2020 and August 2021.

AmeriCorps members served 41,112 students and provided food support services to 56,877 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 2,073 individuals.

AmeriCorps has 4 members in McCracken County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county has received \$650,941 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 218 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP serviced 7,765 people a month in McCracken County, stretching over 3,658 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in FY2022: \$21,044,362

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

FRYSC in McCracken County received \$1,671,149 in funding, grants, community cash, and in-kind contributions with 13 full-time staff and 5 part-time staff.

As of 7/3/2022, there were 111 children in Out of Home Care, 98 of which received a per-diem, for a daily per-diem of \$8,815.

27% of children in the state's care had a goal of adoption.  
72% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

6 child(ren) adopted (YTD)

McCracken County received \$2,710,274 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance supporting up to 720 providers a month.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served on average 3,368 children a month, collecting \$5,033,955 in current and past due child support during FY 2022. They established 190 orders.

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 22,570 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 67,023 of the 178,017 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,023 prescribers and 317 dispenser DEA numbers.

### Syringe Services Programs

McCracken County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$5,880,363 in FY 2022.

Four Rivers served 9,010 individuals in their region.



McCracken is located in the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center region. This region received \$939,279 in Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) funding for FY 2022.

## Public Protection

The Office of the Ombudsman and Administrative Review office had 730 constituent contacts in FY2022 in your county.

Office of Inspector General completed 25,705 background checks for children & elderly services throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

The Office of the Inspector General reported 35 completed survey(s), resulting in 2 total tag(s) in McCracken County.
