\$4,000. Throughout the Commonwealth 84% of all enrolled students received at least one FRYSC service. Over 26,000 caregivers participated in Grandparent/Relative Support Groups, and over 36,000 students participated in FRYSC-sponsored mentoring programs.

McCreary County received \$82,157 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 126 providers a month. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,241 children, collecting \$1,270,600 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2023. The agency established 1,375 orders.

There were 38 children cared for by foster families, 34 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,604.

14% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 60% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
